In the heart of Burgundy, the château de Gilly, former residence of the Cistercian Monks, is located two minutes from the famous village of Vougeot at the heart of the finest wine («Grand Cru») producing area in Burgundy, between Dijon and Beaune. It has preserved its authentic Fourteenth and Sixteenth Century character, reflected in its moats, French-style gardens and dining room with its magnificent vaulted ceiling.

The Château de Gilly is rich in architecture and historical treasures, which have been respectfully restaured and beautifully enhanced for everyone to see:

Ancient medieval kitchen with impressive fireplace, original terra cota tiles with Jean de Nivelle's coat of arms; painted beam ceilings, wall fresco, rib vaults...

Each nook in the castle hides details of past testimonies.
